Imagine it & 1958...

Sir Edmund Hillary has just become the first person in nearly half a century to reach the South Pole. Bryan Barratt-Boyes has successfully performed New Zealand's first open-heart surgery. The All Blacks have won the Bledisloe Cup...again (go, you good thing!). Kiwis are achieving great things. And the same smarts, grit and belly-fire that made these achievements possible can be found in a handful of visionaries with an idea: to establish a school serving up exceptional biblical education, particularly to believers from Open Brethren churches. The result? That year, New Zealand Assembly Bible School (NZABS) was founded in Auckland.

Fast-forward to 1975. Years earlier, a chocolate-makerturned-missionary had established Gospel Literature Outreach (GLO) to promote a radical new idea: short-term missions. In those days, "shortterm" still meant, like, three years (none of these nambypamby two-week missions trips we call "short-term" now!). But three years still requires major training. So in the mid-70s, the GLO Training Centre was set up in Te Awamutu to help wouldbe missionaries from the Open Brethren movement prep for overseas missions.







2000

These two colleges both thrived-more like friends than foes. In fact, they worked so well together that they decided to make it official. In the year 2000, like the kids from Captain Planet, NZABS and GLO combined their academic and missional superpowers to become a single entity: Pathways College of Bible and Mission. Shortly after its beginning under this new name, Pathways moved from a residential to field-based (e.g. internship) model, which has allowed Pathways to retain the best of both its predecessor colleges, topnotch biblical study and realworld practical ministry.



Back to the present day. Pathways College is carrying the torch, living into this rich legacy. The name, structure and haircuts have changed; the goal has not. We're still 100% committed to outstanding biblical and theological education. Throughout our history, we've trained 2000+ women and men to follow Jesus, become more like him and serve him whole-heartedly?

OVIZ PROGRAMMESS

NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) 120 Credits NZQA Level 5

Method of Study: Full-time (1 year) or Part-time (2 years)

Our context-based approach to learning through real-world ministry practice means graduates of this programme have the practical skills and academic knowledge needed for Christian ministry or the marketplace.

This one-year full-time or two years part-time programme, is designed to blend 16 hours theory and 16 hours practice each week by connecting classroom and context through an internship model.

Church and non-church based Christian organisations (e.g. Christian camps, Word of Life, schools, charities) offer internship placements.

Course requirements are met through experienced education practitioners, the guidance of two mentors, the challenges of ministry, formal instruction with peers and directed learning; you will be equipped for Christian ministry and service in the 21st Century. NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) 120 Credits NZQA Level 6

Method of Study: Full-time (1 year)

Unlock your true leadership potential with Christian Leadership Studies.

Our unique training programme will give you the skills to lead with integrity and purpose. We'll help you develop the strategic thinking, problem solving, and decisionmaking skills you need to excel in any leadership role. With our guidance, you'll discover how to effectively communicate your vision and create a lasting impact — all while staying true to your values.

Students are aligned to a Host Organisation throughout the year (church, mission, or parachurch organisation), with which they connect regularly. During the year, students complete two placements (usually around May and September-October) at this Host Organisation to fulfill the requirements for the two practical placement papers.

This structure presents many opportunities to develop relationships and learn leadership skills in practical settings. Students also attend four block courses throughout the year during which students engage with the lecturers and their cohort. This programme consists of these papers:

- Leadership: Biblical Principles & Models
- Leadership: Identity & Calling
- Relational Leadership: Empowering, Ethical & Inclusive
- Working with Groups (Placement)
- Leading in a Digital & Secular Culture
- Leadership in Context (Placement)
- Strategic, Missional, Resilient Leadership

My priorities are Jesus first then having fun. I'm always on the go dividing my time between my role as a Youth Pastor and youth-related activities.

Over a few years I got involved with working with youth and I really wanted to serve the Lord but wasn't sure how. Then I heard about the Pathways College programme and I knew that was the next step for me. BLOCKNEEKS

Students meet together face-to-face throughout the programme at Block Weeks (a week duration each time).

Block Weeks are held at Pacific Park Christian Holiday Camp close to the pristine white, sandy shores of Pāpāmoa Beach, Tauranga.

Students meet once at the beginning of the programme and then again at strategic points during the year. Level 5 students meet six times and Level 6 students meet four times during the year.

Teaching and learning approaches during this time prioritise the opportunity to develop/practise skills, hear and engage with experienced leaders and participate in workshops.

Importantly, these times provide the opportunity for students to share the results of their own study and inquiry with each other and to build relational connections. Sharing meals together evokes a sense of community and there is time to enjoy a stroll on the beach, a surf or a coffee at local cafes.

MENTORTNG

Our programme is supported through a strong mentoring network. Students have mentors to help guide them through ministry and study. You might have two individual mentors, or one mentor who covers your ministry and spiritual growth.



Internship Mentor

A ministry mentor shows interns the ropes within their chosen ministry placement and encourages good ministry habits.



Personal Mentor

This mentor is primarily concerned with the students spiritual development: how their relationship with God is going, how their prayer life is going; and supporting their spiritual needs.



Academic Support

This is provided by the Academic Management Team at Pathways College to ensure students stay on track with their assignment quality, their due dates, and any matters related to academic progress.

NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) (Level 5)

The NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) (Level 5) uses an internship model that includes directed internship learning, requiring supervised experiential education in a local church or Christian organisation, as well as biblical and theological studies provided through block weeks.

We offer an academic internship that engages students in holistic learning; classroom-based teaching integrated with a study course involving guided field education through placement in a ministry context. Past students have interned within their own churches and specialised in ministries including creative media, youth work, children, music, and preaching.

We also partner with Christian Camping NZ and a number of our students choose to intern while they reside at a camp for the year whereas other students intern at Christian schools, mission organisations or in the marketplace.

NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) (Level 6)

The NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) (Level 6) uses a Host Organisation model whereby students are connected to a Host Organisation throughout the year. Students can also do their ministry placement courses (four weeks in Semester One and eight weeks in Semester Two) at this Host Organisation.


We have a variety of different course formats and topics so that each group in your church or ministry can register for the courses they're interested in, or need.

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NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) NZQA Level 5

General Admission for Domestic Students

Applicants must be 16 or older (18 or older for international students) by the start date of the qualification they are applying for, and have successfully completed one of the following:

- NCEA Level 2 or higher, OR
- A national or overseas qualification equivalent to or higher than NCEA Level 2, OR
- A New Zealand Certificate at Level 4 or higher qualification, OR
- The Pathways College Internship Preparatory Programme.

It is a condition of enrolment that students complete a Police Vetting Service Request and Consent form as part of their application.

Domestic applicants (and international applicants registered in New Zealand) must give their consent to undergo a process of Safety Checking as set out in the Vulnerable Children (Requirements for Safety Checks of Children's Workers) Regulations 2015.

This checking process will include:

• Providing two forms of identification, and evidence of any name changes (if any). Consent for the College to undertake a Police Vet check, or a Criminal Record Check (as required), and advise the College of any current charges or pending court matters.

Applicants are also required to consent to the above information gathering as part of the Safety Check to be shared with a host institution for the purposes of practicum placement(s).

NZ Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) NZQA Level 6

General Admission for Domestic Students

Applicants must have evidence of support from a Host Organisation to carry out practical components of the programme and have been awarded the:

- New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Level 5) with strands in Chaplaincy, Christian Leadership, Intercultural Studies, Performing Arts, Te Minita Taha Maori, and Theological Studies [Ref: 2793], OR
- New Zealand Certificate in Christian Studies (Level 5) with strand in Christian Ministry [Ref: 2771], OR



 Have a broad understanding of theology and biblical foundations with a ministry role in a faith-based community.

People aged 18-25 must have experience working with children or young people in a church, camp or community group.

Applicants for whom English is an additional language must have a minimum English Language IELTS (Academic) 6 or equivalent.

Special Entry

Special Entry for Domestic Students

New Zealand applicants who do not meet the standard entry requirements may apply for Special Entry. This considers a person's life experiences and employment history to determine their suitability to study at diploma level 5 or above. Students must be over the age of 20, and

- Submit a Curriculum Vitae, or equivalent, that includes work history, OR
- Provide a written reference and suitable recommendation from a past or current employer outlining work completed (minimum three months employment), OR
- Provide evidence of prior learning that indicates an ability to study at diploma level.

International Students

International applicants must provide a police clearance certificate from their country of citizenship AND for any country in which they have lived for more than a 12-month period in the last 10 years. This police clearance certificate should be less than six months old and be presented at the time of application.

International students in addition to the above, must be 18 or older by the start date of the programme they are applying for and meet the minimum English language requirement.

English Language Requirements

International students must demonstrate English language proficiency. Typically this will be in the form of Academic IELTS test results (or equivalent). For a Level 5 qualification the minimum requirement is 5.5 with no band less than 5.0. For Level 6 qualification the minimum requirement is 6.0 with no band less than 5.5.

International students must hold a current student visa and meet all conditions of that visa.

HOW TO APPLY

HOW TO APPLY IF YOU ARE A NZ RESIDENT

Enrolment is completed online via the Pathways website. All students must also submit the application for police vetting which is a requirement for students enrolled in our programmes.

Offer of an Academic Place

On receipt of a complete application, the Academic Committee considers the application and the outcome. A letter to each applicant advises them of the outcome. An academic place is offered to successful applicants. At this point it is advisable to apply for student loans and allowances if you intend paying for tuition and accommodation using this option. This will help avoid delays in processing by StudyLink. Not all qualifications are eligible, so refer to the relevant fee schedule for more information.

Payment of Fees

The letter offering an academic place to successful applicants will include an invoice for the fees and costs due together with a personalised Public Trust Application form and details on paying fees direct to the Public Trust Student Fee Trust Account. Payment of Pathways College fees is through internet banking and should be made directly to the Public Trust using the information provided on the invoice.

Acceptance of the Offer of an Academic Place

In order to accept the offer of place, you must then

- Confirm in writing your acceptance of the offer of an academic place,
- Complete and return the Public Trust Application Form,
- Supply any other information requested in the Offer of Place letter.

Acceptance into Pathways College Programme

Upon completion of all the requirements for acceptance of the academic place listed above, you will be issued an acceptance letter.

Matt's working out his faith through further theological studies


