to seek God's help and strength continually throughout the year. Through your Spiritual Formation group we will help you wrestle with real issues of life, faith and theology.



NEW ZEALAND DIPLOMA IN CHRISTIAN STUDIES

Theological Studies - (Level 5)

The Internship **Programme**

This one-year programme has been designed to blend theory and practice by connecting classroom and context through the internship model. Course requirements, met through the educative guidance of a mentor, the challenges of ministry, formal instruction with peers and directed learning, equip the student for vocational Christian service. Student involvement in a real situation under experienced practitioners enables informed vocational, transitional, and contextual awareness. Church and non-church based Christian organisations (e.g., Christian Camping, Word of Life) offer internship placements.

The Diploma provides a way for a Christian organisation such as a local church to develop work-ready potential leaders through formal education without losing the ability to influence the student's learning and development. Interns also benefit by learning from experienced leaders in a hands-on practical context, while also receiving lifeimpacting biblical and theological input. The 'how' and the 'why' of Christian ministry are developed together.

This programme uniquely combines internship experience with biblical and theological education through residential block courses and weekly study. It offers a greater proportion of supervised ministry experience

than comparable degree programmes, while still enabling entry into the second year of such programmes.

The Qualification

The New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) (Level 5) is accredited and approved by NZQA and is a NZQF Level 5 programme (Level 5 is equivalent to the first year of an undergraduate university degree).

The Expected **Outcomes**

The Diploma will enable a graduate to

- build biblical and theological foundations while involved in ministry
- gain people-helping skills while gaining practical experience in a church or other Christian organisation
- reflect theologically upon that ministry experience with a mentor
- understand the Bible in some depth and share it with others
- · gain relationship skills by serving in a team
- gain planning and participation skills in ministry events
- observe experienced leaders in action and develop leadership potential
- cultivate habits that maintain spiritual life in the midst of action

MENTORING

Pathways students are required to have three mentors.

Ministry Mentor

A ministry mentor guides interns within their chosen ministry placement and encourages good ministry habits.

Academic Mentor

An academic mentor ensures students are on track with their assignment quality, their due

dates, and provides academic support and guidance.

Spiritual Mentor

This mentor is available to support the student's spiritual development throughout their time of study.




BLOCK COURSES

Throughout the year there are six Block Courses. Attendance at Block Courses is a compulsory part of the programme. Each Block Course is one week long and Block Courses are held at Pacific Park Holiday Camp in Papamoa. Block Courses are a highlight

of the year's programme as they provide the opportunity to spend time with the other students, have face to face contact with the lecturers and engage in a range of other activities related to this internship programme.

The academic year with six block courses looks like this:





NISTRY PLACEMEN

The NZDipCS (Level 5) internship programme provides a holistic educational experience by integrating academic study with placement in a ministry context, such as a church, Christian camp or parachurch organisation. By gaining experience in a ministry setting, students are empowered to put theory into practice and are, therefore, trained for effective real-world ministry.

Entry Requirements

Applicants must be 16 or older (18 or older for international students) by the start date of the qualification they are applying for, and have successfully completed one of the following:

- NCEA level 2 or higher, or
- A national or overseas qualification equivalent to or higher than NCEA level 2, or
- A New Zealand Certificate at level 4 or higher qualification, or
- The Pathways College Internship Preparatory Programme.

It is a condition of enrolment that students complete a Police Vetting Service Request and Consent form as part of their application: Domestic applicants (and international applicants resident in New Zealand) must give their consent to undergo a process of Safety Checking as set out in the Vulnerable Children (Requirements for Safety Checks of Children's Workers) Regulations 2015. This checking process will include:

- Providing 2 forms of identification, and evidence of any name changes (if any).
- Consent for the College to undertake a Police Vet check, or a Criminal Record Check (as required), and advise the College of any current charges or pending court matters.

International applicants must provide a police clearance certificate from their country of citizenship AND for any country in which they have lived for more than a 12-month period in the last 10 years. This police clearance should be less than 6 months old and be presented at the time of application.

Applicants are also required to consent to the above information gathered as part of the Safety Check to be shared with a host institution for the purposes of practicum placement(s).

Special Entry: New Zealand applicants who do not meet the standard entry requirements may apply for Special Entry. This considers a person's life experiences and employment history to determine their suitability to study at diploma level 5 or above.

- Students must be over the age of 20, and submit a Curriculum Vitae, or equivalent, that includes work history, or
- Provide a written reference and suitable recommendation from a past or current employer outlining work completed (minimum 3 months employment), or
- Provide evidence of prior learning that indicates an ability to study at Diploma Level 5.

Admission: International students, in addition to the above, must be 18 or older by the start date of the programme they are applying for and meet the minimum English language requirement, which is an Academic IELTS score of 5.5 with no band score lower than 5.0, or its equivalent in accordance to NZQA Rules 13 Table 2 and/or other NZQA accepted evidence of English language proficiency entry requirement.

THE SCHEDULE

Although the Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) (Level 5) has traditionally been a one-year full-time programme with 120 credits at Pathways College, from 2022 we are also offering this qualification as a two-year part time programme with 60 credits each year (120 credits total). The outline of the courses for both delivery modes are listed here.

Students need to check the conditions of their entitlement for Fees-Free or StudyLink when choosing the part-time option.

THE PROGRAMME FULLTIME

This is a one-year or 120 credit programme consisting of 38 weeks (excluding holidays) with a minimum of 32 hours study per week. Students are held accountable for completing a minimum of 16 hours of practical course work per week within a ministry context. This includes one-on-one supervisor-directed mentored tutorials, course-driven experiential learning, small group learning, and written work to demonstrate competency in the course learning objectives. An additional 16 hours per week study includes attendance at block course lectures (approximately every six weeks), directed study, group work, and self-directed learning. There are 5 holiday/study weeks throughout the year.

PATHWAYS ONLINE

Learn where you like

Online learning is another programme available for students to undertake theological study through our online learning platform.

Courses are delivered via Pathways Connect with study support provided by qualified Pathways tutors. The content can be viewed on a computer or a tablet. Fast speed internet access is recommended. Students will need to have access to a word processing programme in order to complete required assignments, access course notes and other online material.

Students can also audit (i.e. not for credit), our course material online through Pathways College OnDemand. Audit students will watch all the video lectures and have access to course notes and readings but do not need to submit assignments.

Programme structure

All of the content (lectures, readings, assignments) have been developed to fit into our user friendly Moodle platform, Pathways Connect. Each course is delivered over a 20-week semester, commencing either in February or July. Each course contains curated course notes, video based material, online PDFs and access to comprehensive databases for online research. Students will complete several assessments and participate in our online community via Zoom and forums to gain the academic credit for the course.

PATHWAYS COLLEGE SCHOOL OF WORSHIP LEADING

The School of Worship Leading (SoWL) exists to empower you as a worship leader, and to see our church communities engaging in deeper and more transformative worship. Learn more about the biblical, spiritual and practical elements of worship and worship leading from some of Aotearoa's most experienced worship leaders, both online and at SoWL days.

This programme aims to take someone with a great heart and musical ability and mould them into a competent, passionate and equipped worship leader for their church context. You can complete the online SoWL programme part-time over 1 or 2 years. This allows you to remain based in your local church as you develop in your ministry.





The SoWL programme is for anyone who is worship leading or heading up worship teams in their church, whether you are a total newbie or a seasoned pastor. We recommend you have the full support of your church leadership to enrol in SoWL, as you learn new ideas and concepts that you may want to introduce.

The School of Worship Leading programme is not an NZQA accredited course and is therefore not eligible for student loans, allowances or fees free.

SOWL COURSES

BIBLICAL WORSHIP: THEN AND NOW (5 CREDITS)

This course will help you understand the purpose and context of biblical worship, including the role of music in Christian worship. Different approaches to leading, rehearsing and arranging will also be discussed and applied.



WORSHIP LEADING (5 CREDITS)

Worship leaders from all around Aotearoa have contributed to this course in areas of leadership, musicianship, team building, technical, planning, confidence and spiritual development.

INTERPRETING THE BIBLE (10 CREDITS)

This course helps you build a method for opening the Bible up so that it can be interpreted and applied accurately.

SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY 1 & 2 (10 CREDITS)

These courses explore various essential topics by examining some of the fundamentals of Christian theology; God, Humanity and the World and Christ, Spirit and the Church.

SUPERVISED MINISTRY TRAINING (30 CREDITS)

This course establishes a good balance between ministry, academics and spiritual formation, including aspects of supervision practices, goal setting, reflection processes, and songwriting.



APPLY NOW FOR

NZDipCS (Level 5) Internship

Enrolment is completed online via the Pathways website. All students must also submit the application for police vetting which is a requirement for all students enrolled in the internship programme. Offer of an Academic Place

On receipt of a completed application, it is considered at the next Academic Committee Management meeting. Applicants are then advised of the outcome of the meeting. A studentship is offered to successful applicants. At this point it is advisable to apply for student loans and allowances if you intend paying for tuition and accommodation using this option. This will help avoid delays in processing by StudyLink. Not all qualifications are eligible, so refer to the relevant fee schedule for more information.

Payment of Fees

The letter offering an academic place to successful applicants will include an invoice for the fees and costs due together with a personalised Public Trust Application form and details on paying fees direct to the Public Trust Student Fee Trust Account. Payment of Pathways College fees is through internet banking and should be made directly to the Public Trust using the information provided on the invoice.

Acceptance of the Offer of an Academic Place

In order to accept the offer of place, you must then

- Confirm in writing your acceptance of the offer of an academic place,
- Complete and return the Public Trust Application Form,
- Supply any other information requested in the Offer of Place letter.

Acceptance into Pathways College Programme

Upon completion of all the requirements for acceptance of the academic place listed above, you will be issued an acceptance letter.

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
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
